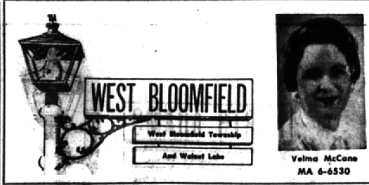
Members Decorate Tree at Clinic
