**Residents Must Petition For Bond Amendment**

FRANKLIN — Property owners interested in having roads resurfaced on an extended time payment plan will have to petition the council to have a bonding amendment placed on the March ballot, it was decided Monday night.

At a special meeting, the council discussed at length the issue which was defeated by a narrow margin in 1956, when the 8-mill road tax was passed.

COUNCILMEN agreed in principle that a bonding amendment to the charter would be advisable and desirable at this time, but they contended that it was up to the people to generate enthusiasm for the idea by having to secure enough signatures from their neighbors and other residents on a petition.

Referring to a letter from Richard Oberschulte, of Colony Hill and a recommendation of the advisory committee suggesting the council consider giving the question another ground at the polls, the councilmen contended the question should reflect the desire of at least the necessary 116 residents, before appearing on the ballot.

IT WAS unanimously conceded that areas considering back-patching should strive to have the work done while roads are in their prime condition following corrections made by the 8-mill project. Special assessments for the work have been set up on a cash-on-the-line basis.

The bonding amendment would simply help spread the cost over a longer period of time, thus giving more areas the opportunity to proceed with hard-surfacing, if desired, with fewer instances of hardship.

**190 Men Graduates Of Police Program**

A total of 190 men graduated last week from the Basic Police Training Program sponsored by the Southeastern Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police in cooperation with the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The graduation luncheon for the seventh class was held at Devon Gables Hillside Room with Donald S. Hostetter as the principal speaker. He is special agent in charge of the Detroit office of the FBI. Birmingham Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley was the toastmaster.

**Storm Sewer Trial Slated For Jan. 10**

LATHRUP — Jan. 10 at 9 a.m. is the time set for trial of the Louise Lathrup Kelley against the City. City Attorney Everett Hayes announced at Monday's council meeting.

The suit, which has halted the city's storm water sewer program, was brought in June. In it, Mrs. Kelley alleges that she would be paying taxes to retire a bond issue for storm sewers that would not service her land.

HAYES SAID an earlier date court date, originally set for today before Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Clark J. Adams, was postponed so that the suit could be tried on consecutive days.

If tried today, testimony would probably have to be continued in January as cases will not be heard on Friday of this week.

ON THE SANITARY sewer, recently completed, connection date to the Evergreen Interceptor was tentatively set for this week. City Administrator Jerald Stone was directed to supply the state health department with monthly reports of total flow.

Only seven downspout disconnection violation cases remain to be resolved, Stone said. Scheduled for a Dec. 12 appearance in the local justice court, four were adjourned to a later date; two involve absentee property owners.

**Tentatively Approve 14-Evergreen Plat**

BEVERLY HILLS — Village officials Monday granted tentative approval to a plat presented by William J. Paul, developer of property at 14 Mile Road and Evergreen.

The plans for the southeast corner R-1 development were approved by the village planners. The subdivision will have 48 lots on 28 acres.
