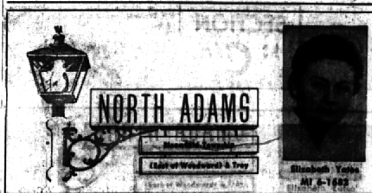

Carol Rodgers To Wed in June



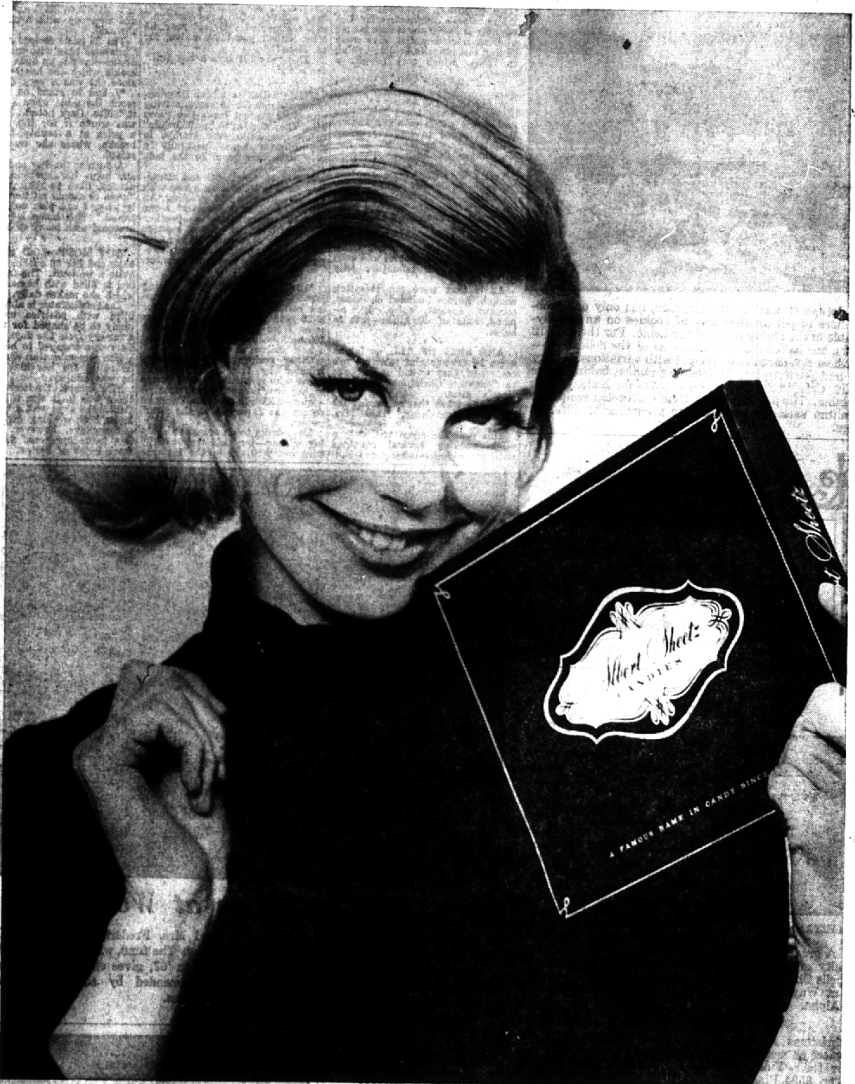
