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State Colleges' Group OK's Coordinating Plan

Members of the Association of Governing Boards and Presidents of State Universities and Colleges of Michigan have approved a proposal to submit to the governing boards of the 10 member universities and colleges a plan for strengthening voluntary coordination of public higher education in Michigan.

The plan proposes a new Michigan Coordinating Council for Public Higher Education in the state.

The new council's membership, as outlined in the plan, provides for a representative from each governing board of Michigan's four-year state colleges and universities; their presidents; the state superintendent of public instruction; and a representative of the junior colleges of the state.

Bi-monthly meetings are planned with 10 members making a quorum.

THE PLAN was sponsored by a coordination study committee of the association under the chairmanship of Eugene B. Power, a member of the board of regents of the University of Michigan.

He said the new agency would make use of the resources and staff of the Lansing office of the Michigan Council of State College Presidents headed by Dr. H. C. Chambers, executive director.

The association members also approved appropriations for high priority study and action by the proposed new Coordinating Council for Public Higher Education. It was proposed by Don Stevens, a member of the Michigan State University Board of Trustees.

MSU PRESIDENT John A. Jannah, chairman of the Michigan Council of State College Presidents, urged association support for a proposed campus building authority program now under consideration by the state's legislative interim committee on the chairmanship of Senator Carlton H. Morris.

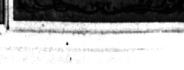
