**MSUO Offers Study Skills**

Forty-two high school juniors, seniors, college students and adults are giving up late sleep Saturday mornings for an opportunity to consider "How to Study" at a Study Skills Workshop offered this term at Michigan State University, Oakland.  
Reservations are now being taken by MSUO Division of Continuing Education for another Saturday morning workshop series beginning Feb. 3.  
Harold J. Abrams, consultant supervisor in special education, Oakland County Board of Education, directs a group of specialists in study skills instruction. This is a course assisting the participant in increasing study efficiency and sharpening practices considered essential in successful academic performance.  
SPECIFIC INSTRUCTION in study skills and attitudes; reading speed and comprehension; and vocabulary development are included in the present workshop. Merrill Miller, counselor at Seaholm High School, leads sessions in study skills.  
A planned addition to the winter workshops will be training in test preparation. A quick note-taking system is taught students early in

the series. An orientation lecture and film begins each Saturday morning's work.  
Particularly valuable, according to the students, is the opportunity for individual student-staff conferences on study problems and difficulties. The personal attention is one reason enrollment must be limited for the workshops.
