DOWN TO EARTH Hints for Decorating To Save Time in '62

This column has been written especially for you to clip, file and bring out about Dec. 1st of next year as you join the multitude of frustrated people who wonder: "How shall I decorate the outside of my home with lights this Christmas?"

Your writer drove around town observing the decorations in various communities and will be judging their merits later with a team of critics.

Where there are garden clubs centers in various areas it was obvious that the quality of performance of decorating was better. Why don't these various branches of National Parks and Garden plan on Christmas in November, open to friends and members, when they will be helping each other with exterior lighting problems like they often assist others with flower and garden arrangement?

The first step is to study the architecture of the house. If your house is colonial style, you want, implicitly and d the old fashion Christmas picture. If you have a ranch home with contemporary design, you will be looking for a play on color and light and line.

Regardless of Mrs. Burlingame's house plan, you do not use your porch light per se. The glare will spoil all of the work you have done to decorate your door. Most doors are attractive and with a simple designed motif they can look elegant. So at your doorway, plan to use a spotlight from a floodlight as you are not selling the house).

AVOID LIGHTS around the perimeter of the roof line. This effect takes on the character of a dog stand. Gather all your lights; sort them according to color using one color on each evergreen. One house had used a green spotlight at each end of the home. Trained toward the corner, it caught the profile of the shrubs. This idea was good.

ANOTHER HOME had used a spotlight with a colored disc over the lens. It was focused on the profile of an attractive tree, a la Fort Lauderdale.

IF YOU HAVE children, you might like to use a Santa suit benefit by an experience we had one year: A Santa suit had been carefully placed over a body of chicken wire on the roof. It had to be anchored with many wires due to wind and rain. The day after Christmas the fine fellow had to come down because he just did not look appropriate after the big day.

Candles, which are illuminated bulbs always look good. The blue lights in the candle fixture give the best decorative effect.

WREATHS ARE an important part of our decorations. One house had as its only decoration a large triple size wreath on a large exterior wall. It had a huge red bow and colored balls in the same color scattered on the wreath. A spotlight created a superb effect.

A few evergreen branches placed together with a bow and some glitter will look elegant on a door with a spotlight.

A wreath with Italian lights of one color is always good while another prize winner seen was a wreath with red lights around it and a blue spotlight trained on it.

ONE DARK GREEN door had a green wreath sprayed white. There was a huge red bow with groupings of small balls to match the color of the bow. It, too, was spotlighted at the entrance to this colonial home.
