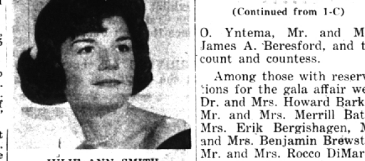
Couple Exchanges Vows In Congregational Church
