

# Local Educators Help Plan Secondary School Meeting

BLOOMFIELD HILLS — When the annual convention of the National Association of Secondary School Principals is held in Detroit, Feb. 11 to 15, several local educators not only will attend, but will also have assisted in planning for the event.

In addition Bloomfield Hills residents, George Romney, will speak at the association's annual banquet Feb. 11 at Lake Hall.

Several area schools have been chosen for a tour by visiting principals, some 2,000 of whom are expected at the convention. Those schools are Groves High and Derby Junior High School in the Birmingham school system and Bloomfield Hills Junior High School.

ROSS WAGNER, principal of Bloch High, is heading the program and decorations committees for the convention. Serving with him is Robert Ford of Derby. James Burchett of Groves is on the school-visiting committee from Bloomfield Hills High School. Principal Richard Speis is serving on the Bloch High committee and dean of girls, Bettie Sanders, is on the hospitality committee.

OTHER LOCAL educators who will attend convention sessions are Roy Vanette, head of Barnum Junior High; Edwin Murray, dean of men at Bloomfield Hills High; and from Bloomfield Hills High—Principal William McGuire; Harry Smith, dean of boys, and Jean Siderlet, dean of girls.

A culture tour arranged for convention delegates will include a visit to Cranbrook Institute, Cranbrook School for Boys, Kingwood and Brookside.

THIS IS THE first time that a Detroit has hosted a convention of secondary school principals, although the organization was founded in Detroit 45 years ago.

In addition to entertainment planned for the group, each day will include study-group programs dealing with current educational problems.

## GOP To Issue Finance Facts

The Oakland County Republican organization this week will issue its first "shareholders report" to more than 15,000 persons who contributed to the organization's 1960 finance drive.

John A. Gibbs, executive secretary of the county GOP committee, said the report will be the first step in bringing contributors into active participation in county GOP political affairs.

Each contributor, regardless of the amount of his contribution, automatically becomes a member of the newly devised county GOP advisory committee, Gibbs said.

THE ADVISORY group, whose aim is to provide a structure through which any voter can make his voice heard in GOP affairs, was ordered into existence by county chairman Arthur G. Elliott Jr.

"The idea we're trying to drive home is that every Republican has a deep responsibility to support and work for his party," Gibbs explained. "In a very real sense we regard every contributor and worker as a shareholder in the party, and we feel that a means should be provided for them to express their opinions on party business."

The shareholders report will be issued annually, Gibbs said. It will include an analysis of the party's political position, a financial report, a resume of future plans and goals, and a breakdown of all organizational activities.

"THE MAIN THING we're after is to let these people know exactly what their party's been doing and where it's heading—and how they can help in the job ahead," Gibbs said.

Gibbs added that the advisory committee members will be sent questionnaires on a regular basis to enable them to express their views on important business and issues.
