**Chrysler Sues
Jack Minor**

Chrysler Corporation's legal
action against Friday as the
corporation filed another suit in
Oakland County Circuit Court
against Jack W. Minor of Bir-
mingham.

The suit asked that the ousted
marketing director of the Plym-
outh-DeSoto-Valiant Division be
required to account for his connec-
tions with four other firms while
he was a Chrysler official.

In addition, the suit calls for
payment of any profits obtained
through transactions with the
firms.

THE FIRMS INVOLVED are
W & M Sales Co., Bel-Aire Pro-
cess, Inc., Transportation Advertis-
ing Co. and Taxi-Ad Co.

Chrysler claims that Minor held
a 50 per cent interest in W & M
Sales, which received over \$80,000
in commissions from the other
three companies. Thus, Chrysler
claims, Minor received profits in
violation of his duties as a Chrysler
executive.

The suit asked that W & M
Sales be restrained from distrib-
uting Minor's assets and that the
National Bank of Detroit be or-
dered not to distribute bonds and
stock Minor claims is his under
the stock program.

A show-cause hearing has been
set for Feb. 14 by Circuit Court
Judge Clark J. Adams.

SERO SAARINEN
**WSU to Confer
Honorary Degree
On Hero Saarinen**

Fero Saarinen, principal partner
of Fero Saarinen and Associates,
1300 N. Woodward, Birmingham,
will be one of six recipients of
honorary degrees from Wayne
State University at commencement
exercises in Detroit at 8:30 p. m.
today.

Others to be honored are the Rt.
Rev. Richard S. Emrich, bishop of
the Diocese of Michigan, Episcopal
Church; Mrs. Josephine F. Gomon,
Detroit civic leader; Mrs. Pauline
Park Wilson Knapp, president of
Merrill-Palmer Institute; Richard
H. McFeely, principal of the
George School, Bucks County, Pa.;
and architect Ludwig Mies van der
Rohe of Chicago.

All alumni of Yale University,
Saarinen will be presented with a
doctor of humanities degree.

HIS CITATION calls attention
to the fact that he is "internation-
ally known as an architect of
consummate taste and mastery skill,
his public commissions have con-
sistently demonstrated a happy
fusion of sound structural engi-
neering, imaginative designing,
rich and varied materials, and
skillfully original function."

unfolded a large appliance ad-
vertisement he had cut out of the
Miami Herald that very morning.
It advertised a home automatic
refrigerator. "... for just a few
dollars down and the balance in 24
months."

"This type of merchandising
credit today is going to catch up
to the nation's pocketbooks,"
Babson explained to Miller and me.
"The private installment debt may
become stretched so thin that the
first serious unemployment condi-
tion that impacts upon our nation
will hurt the business and financial
areas of our economy. It could be-
come a real threat to business ad-
vance."

Since this interview, nine years
ago, U.S. installment credit has ac-
celerated vastly. Considerable un-
employment now exists.

Was Roger Babson accurately
prophesying the future? Time
alone will tell, of course.

association.

Each invited her to the meeting
Sunday to accept one of the state
championship or reserve awards.
It was the first she knew of them.
"I had no idea I had been
awarded so many points," said
Alison.

It is an accomplishment that is
unique, according to the associa-
tion's Secretary-Treasurer Ardith
Neath of Lowell.

As far back as association rec-
ords go, Miss Neath stated, "There
has never been anyone who has
won that much in a single year."

"I KNOW of no man, woman or
junior who has ever made such an
outstanding record."

Alison was competing in certain
classes against riders of all ages,
even professionals, Miss Neath ex-
plained.

Alison was only 13 last summer
when she earned her champion-
ship. Their categories are:

1) Over the fences—to the girl
or boy 13 and under winning the
1950 shows for jumping various
types of fences in the ring. Judging is
the rider alone, his form and con-
trol of the horse.

2) Hunter seat—to the boy or
girl 13 and under winning the
points based on the manner in
which he sits and controls his

horse in the walk, trot and canter.

3) MICHIGAN Hunt's perpetual
junior challenge trophy—to the
Michigan boy or girl, 12 to 18,
acquiring high-point score in judg-
ing on the basis of gait, hands and
control of the horse.

4) Marie J. DeWitt challenge
trophy—to the rider of any age or
sex, riding either park (graded),
Western or hunter class horse, who
accumulates the most points dur-
ing the year.

5) PIA (Professional Horse-
men's Association of Michigan)
junior working hunter cham-
pionship—for horses owned by girls
and boys 18 and under, based on
the horse's "way of going" in the
field, under simulated hunting con-
ditions.

The sixth, the reserve cham-
pionship was won by Sonino for
what was judged the second most out-
standing performance of any
working hunter during the season.
