### Rice Cagers Win Another

Brother Rice High won its 10th consecutive basketball game Friday against Catholic Central, 48-35. The new school, which has only 9h graders, plays against high or junior high schools with teams composed of the same grade.

Big Dave Walter 6-3 tied a second period uprising for Rice, which eventually proved to be the deciding factor of the game.

WALTER scored all of his team's 17 second period points. He finished the night with 27. Bill Moore and Paul Jagels added 10 tallies and Mike Callahan scored one.

The Rice cagers were down 8-7 at the end of the first quarter but with Walter leading the way, stormed back to a 24-16 halftime lead.

Pouring in two points for every one that Catholic Central got, Rice jumped to a 17 percent lead in the third stanza and a 38-23 overall lead.

RESTING IN the fourth quarter, the Rice battlers were outscored 12-10. But the margins of the second and third periods were more than enough for their 10th straight win without a defeat.

Jack Byrns led Central with 13 points while Joe Corley added 10. Rice plays tonight at Himey Junior High in Southfield. Game time is 8 p.m.

### Cranes Win One of Three

Cranbrook won its basketball game but lost in wrestling and hockey last week.

### VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 45

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PURCHASE, POSSESSION OR TRANSPORTATION OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS BY MINORS, PROHIBITING OWNERS OF MOTOR VEHICLES FROM PERMITTING MINORS TO POSSESS OR TRANSPORT ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS THEREIN, AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

THE VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1. No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall purchase or knowingly possess or transport any alcoholic liquor, or knowingly possess, transport or have under his control in any motor vehicle any alcoholic liquor unless said person is employed by a licensee under the Michigan Liquor Control Act as now or hereafter amended, and is possessing, transporting or having such alcoholic liquor in a motor vehicle under his control during regular working hours and in the course of his employment.

Section 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than \$100.00 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or shall be both fined and imprisoned, in the discretion of the court.

Section 3. At any time within thirty (30) days following the conviction of any such person for the violation of the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance, which conviction has become final, complaint may be made by the arresting officer or his superior before a justice of the peace or municipal judge of the court from which was issued the warrant, which complaint shall be under oath and shall contain a description of the motor vehicle in which such alcoholic liquor was possessed or transported by said minor committing such offense and praying that said motor vehicle be impounded as provided in this section. Upon the filing of said complaint, a justice or municipal judge of said court shall issue an order to the owner of said property to show cause, if any, why said motor vehicle shall not be impounded as provided herein. Such order to show cause shall have a date and time fixed therein for the hearing thereof, which date shall not be less than ten days from the issuance and shall be served by delivering a true copy thereof to said owner at any time not less than three (3) full days before the date of hearing or, if the owner cannot be located, by sending a true copy by certified mail to the last known address of said owner. In case said owner is a non-resident of the State of Michigan, service thereof may be made upon the secretary of state as provided in Section 403 of Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949 of the State of Michigan.

If the court determines upon the hearing of said order to show cause, from competent and relevant evidence, that at the time of commission of said offense said motor vehicle was being driven by said minor with the express or implied consent or knowledge of said owner, and that the use of said motor vehicle is not needed by the owner in the direct pursuit of his employment or the actual operation of his business, the court shall authorize the impounding of said vehicle for a period to be determined by the court of not less than fifteen (15) days nor more than thirty (30) days. The courts order authorizing the impounding of said vehicle shall authorize any peace officer to take possession without the process of said car wherever located and to store the same in a public or private garage at the expense and risk of the owner of said vehicle. Appeal shall lie from such order to the circuit court of said county and the provision governing the taking of appeals from judgments for damages shall be applicable thereto; provided, that nothing herein shall prevent any bona fide holder from exercising any rights under such lien.

Section 4. Any person who shall knowingly transfer title to any motor vehicle for the purpose of avoiding the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00 or be imprisoned for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or to both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect 10 days following its publication.
