Start Michigan Week Plans

Planning and organization for the observance of Michigan Week in Oakland County, May 21-27, was the purpose of a recent meeting at Bloomfield Hills County Club. Representing Mayor Florence Willett, Birmingham chairman for the annual promotion—designed to focus attention on Michigan's abundant attractions as a good place in which to live and work—was Birmingham Commissioner William E. Roberts. Oakland County General Chairman Charles F. Adams, executive vice president of MacManus, John & Adams, Inc., was host to eight local chairmen; named to his committee, and a representative group of civic leaders and county newspaper editors, including George William Averill, managing editor of The Eccentric. Averill was named Birmingham publicity chairman.

ADAMS CALLED attention to the need for concerted, vigorous effort at the community level. "It is particularly important," he said, "to direct the attention of our own citizens to Michigan's steadily increasing advantages as a place in which to live and to work. Its favorable business climate and unsurpassed recreational opportunities."

Regional co-chairman Dr. William E. Stirtion, vice president and director of the Dearborn Center, University of Michigan, detailed state planning, organization and objectives.

\$34,592 Is B'ham's Share Of State Fund
Oakland County will receive \$857,234 of the state's \$43,238,309 in Motor Vehicle Highway Fund collections for the final quarter of 1960. Of the Birmingham areas within Oakland County Birmingham will receive \$34,592; Bloomfield Hills, \$2,700; Beverly Hills, \$123; Bingham Farms, \$1,040; Franklin, \$4,801; Lathrup Village, \$6,297; and Southfield, \$29,049. The State Highway Department has started distributing the funds to Michigan's 83 counties and 610 incorporated cities and villages. According to State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie, the net receipts of \$43,238,309 represent an increase of \$5,000,000 over the same period of 1959.

GROSS collections amounted to \$44,919,485, from which collection costs of \$2,700,000 were deducted. A Commission charge of \$102,170 were deducted. The amount of gas, weight and diesel fuel taxes and a small amount of miscellaneous fees are deposited in the Motor Vehicle Highway Fund. After deductions, the rest of the fund is distributed under provisions of state law which provides that 45 per cent goes to the State Highway Department for use on state highways, 35 per cent to counties, 10 per cent to cities, and 18 per cent to incorporated cities and villages for their roads and streets.

Sewer Committee Blocks Politicking
Sanitary Sewer Committee members have condemned all efforts to draw them or their efforts to find a solution to the city's sewer needs into Toy's political campaign. UNDER THIS FORMULA, the State Highway Department will receive \$20,322,047 as its share of the fourth quarter collections while the counties will receive \$15,133,440 and the incorporated cities and villages will get \$7,782,918. Snow removal funds totaling \$565,819 were deducted from the county's share as provided by law, and distributed to counties which have the greatest snowfall last winter.
