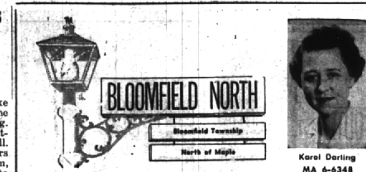
Tri Deltas Plan Theatre Party
