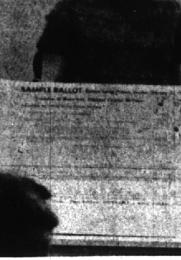
8 File Petitions For Council Posts In Beverly Hills

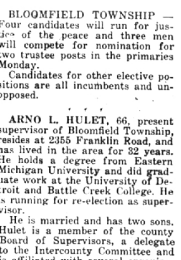
