## B'field Adopts Trailer Park Ordinance

**BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP**—An ordinance controlling trailer parks in Bloomfield Township was adopted by the township board at its meeting Monday night.

The ordinance will become a part of the township zoning code. It provides that all township trailer courts shall have direct access to and abut on a federal or state highway. A four foot wall or fence shall be provided on all sides of the trailer court except at entrances and exits.

**THE LAND AREA** of a court shall provide for a minimum of 50 and a maximum of 15 trailer coach sites. Eighty per cent of the sites shall contain a minimum of 3,000 square feet, and 20 per cent not less than 2,400 square feet per site.

Site area are to be computed exclusive of drives, facilities and recreation space.

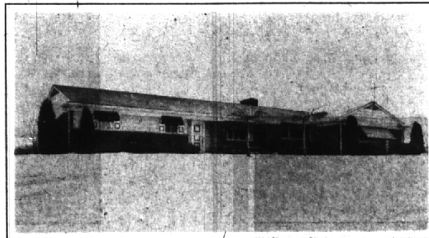

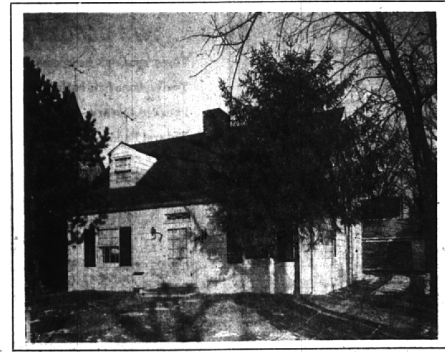
