David Lawrence in his editorial "Why Not 'Quarantine' Them?" (U.S. News & World Report — 7/25/60) advocated breaking all ties with the Soviet and its satellites unless they get out of Cuba and the Western Hemisphere.

Senator Barry Goldwater, in a speech on the floor of the senate on March 15, 1960, said: "We should declare the world Communist movement an outlaw in the community of civilized nations."

How can the presence of Soviet bloc nations be accepted in the United Nations—which is dedicated to peace?

ON AUG. 22, 1960, Congressman Michael A. Feighan of Ohio introduced H. Con. Res. 716 in the House of Representatives.

In this resolution he called for the U.S. to seek Soviet Russia's expulsion from the United Nations.
