WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

Baby Feeding

- Hernia
- Grapefruit
- Flavored Aspirin
- Dreaming Necessaries

Q. Should babies be fed on a schedule or "on demand?"
A. Many doctors believe in "on demand" feeding. This means that the child be fed whenever he is hungry. It doesn't imply that the baby be made to go through a protracted period of crying in order to have his hunger satisfied.

Q. Will exercise strengthen the stomach muscles and make a hernia go away?
A. No. The weak point between the abdomen and diaphragm consists of overlapping layers of fibrous tissue—not muscle—and fibrous tissue does not respond to exercise as does muscle. Anyone with a hernia, who engages in strenuous exercise is inviting trouble. With certain exceptions, hernias should be corrected surgically.

Q. Which has more food value—white or pink grapefruit?
A. Pink grapefruit is said to be nutritionally superior to white varieties.
