Safety Officer Will Visit B'ham Schools

A police officer whose jingles and catchy tunes were heard by more than 80,000 Michigan grade school youngsters last year will bring his traffic safety program to the pupils of Pierce, Beverly Hills and Walnut Lake Schools on March 6.

Lt. Wilburn Legree, known as the "Singing Cop," will present an hour-long program on child safety at 9 a. m., 10:30 a. m. and 1:15 p. m. at Pierce, Beverly Hills and Walnut Lake schools respectively.

Lt. Legree, child safety consultant for the Associated Petroleum Industries of Michigan, was formerly child safety director of the Flint Police Department, retiring after 25 years of service.

Last year he appeared before more than 76,000 elementary school children in 202 public and parochial schools and instructed nearly 5,000 school safety patrol members.

Lt. Legree includes in his program a child safety film and teaches the children a number of the many safety songs which he and his wife have written to appeal to young pupils. His songs are used by schools and police departments in 48 states and in 600 schools in Michigan.

He has been widely acclaimed by police and school authorities nationally for his novel methods of teaching safety rules to young children.

Lt. Legree also acts as a voluntary adviser to local school patrol groups and assists school authorities with the solution of local school traffic hazards.

"TRAFFIC SAFETY can be a pretty dull and dry subject for children," Lt. Legree said. "But if we can get them to learn a few simple songs with a message applicable to the traffic conditions all young children meet we can get them interested in spite of themselves."

Lt. Legree visited Birmingham last September, giving safety assembly programs for two days at Torrey School, Franklin Middle, Bloomfield Village and Quarten schools.

Four Birmingham area high school bands will join other Oakland and Macomb county schools in the district four band festival sponsored by the Michigan School Bands and Orchestra Association at Utica High School Feb. 25.

Groves High School Band will perform at 11:45 a. m. Southdale at 4:15 p. m.; Seaholm at 5:15 p. m.; and Groves Junior High at 8 p. m.

The auditorium and gymnasium will both have a different band performing every half hour beginning at 8 a. m.

BANDS WILL NOT compete against one another for divisional honors, but rather against a set of standards. Groups receiving a first division rating will thereby qualify to enter the state festival later in the year.

Adjustments for the festival are Leonard Falcone, Stanley Finn, and Keith Stein of Michigan State University; George Wain of Oberlin College; Dr. William D. Fitch of Eastern Michigan University; Norman Diets of Central Michigan University; Charles Minelli of Ohio University; and Mark DeLeonard of Wayne University.

Irvin Nichols of Clawson is the festival chairman. Louis Gonda of Utica is host chairman, and Edwin Nawrock of Armada is the president of District Four.

EXCEPT for a small charge for programs to defray the cost of printing, there will be no charge for admission, and the public is cordially invited. An estimated 2400 school musicians will perform. The Utica Band Parents will be in charge of refreshments in the Wiley Cafeteria.

Oak Park will host the second half of the district festival on March 4.

Sepeshy Receives Oil Painting Award

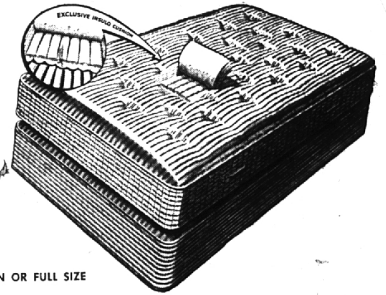

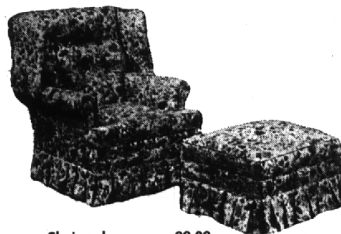
