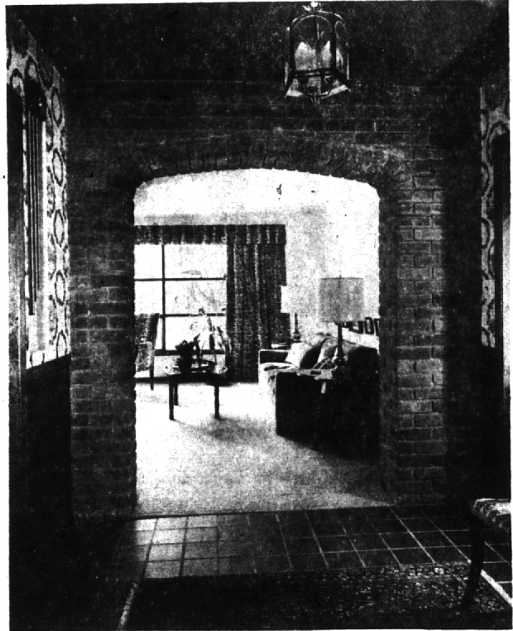
Crystal to Highlight Coffee Break Time

Resident Cited In U.S. Ruling

Roy Fruhauf of Birmingham, president of Fruhauf Trailer Co., Detroit, is among six others recently cited by the U.S. Supreme Court as being subject to prosecution by the Justice Department.
Also named as defendants are former Teamster president Dave Beck and four other trucking employers.
The government charges that these trucking employers illegally earned \$300,000 in 1954. The Supreme Court's 8-1 decision reinstated proceedings dismissed Feb. 18, 1959, by Federal District Judge Sidney Sugarman of New York. Sugarman found the charge was not a crime within the Taft-Hartley labor law, under which the prosecution was brought.

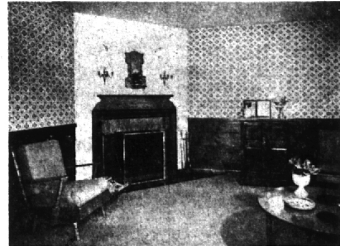
