champions.

LAST YEAR, he was elected president of the Detroit Kennel Club.

It would appear that he wouldn't have time for much else. But, Teeter is also owner of Hemphill & Co., factory representatives for electrical construction material.

Frank Hardy, of Hibernia Kennels, Long Island, N.Y., is Teeter's handler, who shows the Birmingham's champions throughout the country.

Last week, Teeter went to the largest indoor show in the world put on by the Westminster Kennel Club at Madison Square Garden, in New York.

"We came second in the group (Hounds). And I feel that if we would have won the group, it would have been our best chance to take the best of show," said Teeter after coming home from his honor-winning trip to New York.

"There were 2500 dogs in that show. Banshee beat the 3 other Bassets, then competed against the 23 hounds which won their breed. "A Toy Pooodle, Cr. Cappeloun, Little Sister, took best of show."

Names of the dogs entered in the show read like a list of United Nations representatives.

HOW DO OWNERS name their dogs, Teeter was asked.

"Well, usually a dog is named according to the country or language spoken in the country from which the breed originated. As you can see, this would quite often bring about some very unusual names.

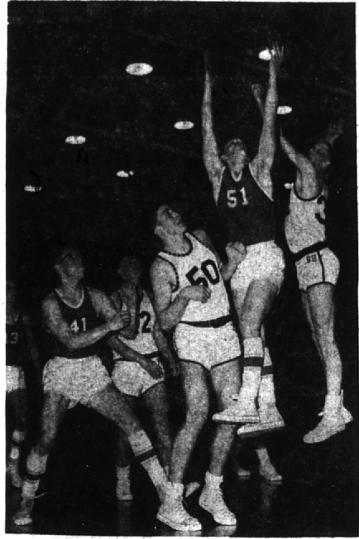
"I try to name my dogs as simple as possible. Lazy Bones, was just that. Banshee is majestic and spirited. I have a real good Basset. I'm grooming for the championship, called Longview Acres Just Katy. (Longview Acres is the name of Teeter's kennels on Long Lake Road).

"BANSHEE will be on exhibition at the Detroit Kennel Club's show at the State Fair Coliseum, March 4-6. She will not be in the contest, since I'm president of the sponsoring organization.

"The day preceding the all-breed show, the Basset Hound Club of Detroit will hold its show at the Coliseum."

What does Mrs. Teeter think about all this barking around the house?
