GRAVES' record is now 6-1.

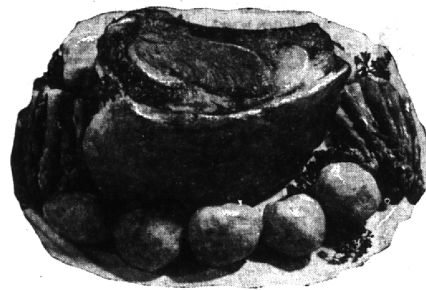
