'Inner City' Is January Theme For Churchwomen

The first meeting this year of the Episcopal Churchwomen of Christ Church Cranbrook will be held Tuesday. It will adhere to the regular schedule with Holy Communion at 10 a.m.; workshops and study groups at 10:30 and luncheon and worship in the dining room at 12:15 p.m.

Luncheon speaker Mel Ravitz, head of the Detroit Metropolitan Planning Commission, will discuss the problems of the Inner City from the viewpoint of the city planners.

The January Study Group theme for the month will be "The Challenge of the Inner City." This program was co-ordinated by the Rev. Louis G. Gillette, Vicar of Nativity Episcopal Church assisted by the Rev. Joseph A. Pelham, director of social relations in the diocese.

During the month several different points of view will be presented by speakers.

On Jan. 24, Frederick B. Routh, head of the Fair Employment Practices Commission, will talk about the divisions of people (racial, economic, and other divisions) and the areas in which they exist.

The same afternoon the Rev. Gillette and the Rev. Pelham will begin a series of three talks that will continue for the next two Tuesday mornings.

Luncheon speaker on Jan. 24, Jerome E. Bates of Church Youth Service, will discuss the problems of youth in the metropolis.

William Clark, Executive Director of Big Brothers of Highland County will conclude the series on Jan. 31 with a discussion of root causes of juvenile delinquency.

Missionary to Speak At Methodist Church

The Rev. Kenneth Enright, a Methodist missionary in the Congo for the last 10 years, will speak at the First Methodist church at Maple and Pleasant on Sunday at 6:30 p.m.

Rev. Enright has taught at Mulungwani for five years and has been district superintendent of the Sandao District for five years.

His work has consisted of supervising about 100 Christian workers in directing 38 schools. He has also been engaged in Evangelical work and in the opening of new churches in the bushlands of the Congo.

First Methodists Announce Plans for School of Missions

On Jan. 22 Raj Kumar Michael of the Inrnam Institute at Ghazabad, U.P., India who has been helping his government with the social and economic development of the villages of India, will show the congregation the work that is being done at the institute.

On Jan. 29 new members in the church will have an opportunity to see pictures of the work being done by Dr. and Mrs. White in Africa. The program will cover their experiences from the time they were in Belgium to the present.

Jehovah's Witnesses Plan Special 3-Day Assembly in Pontiac

Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955 as amended, provides in part as follows:

"The Inspectors of Election at any annual or special election shall not receive the vote of any person residing in a registration school district whose name is not registered as an elector in the city or township in which he resides . . ."

THE LAST DAY on which persons may register with the appropriate city or township clerks of the city or township in which they reside in order to be eligible to vote at said Special Election is Friday, January 20, 1961. Persons registering after 5:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time on said Friday, January 20, 1961, will not be eligible to vote at said Special School Election.

Under the provisions of Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the appropriate city or township clerks of the city or township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with city or township clerks must ascertain the days and hours on which the clerk's office is open for registration.
