SAE Expects Large Turnout For Congress

The First International Congress and Exposition of Automotive Engineers, to be held Jan. 9-13 in Detroit's Cobo Hall, will attract the largest gathering of engineers and scientists ever assembled at one time and place.

This was the forecast today of H. C. MacDonal, of Bloomfield Hills, secretary of the Detroit section of the 25,000-member Society of Automotive Engineers. The SAE is sponsor of the world-wide assembly.

A large group of both SAE members and non-members of the Birmingham area is expected to attend, he said.

MacDonal, Chief Engineer of the Lincoln-Mercury Division, Ford Motor Company, who lives at 1021 Club Drive, Bloomfield Hills, cited the international aspect of the Congress as one of the major drawing factors.

"COBO HALL PROVIDES us the space and facilities to attract engineers from abroad," MacDonal, pointed out.

"Our technical program will be held in foreign engineering content. Of the 150 papers to be presented at the Congress, 35 will be by engineers and scientists from foreign countries."

More than 100,000 technicians have been invited to attend the Congress. More than 200 ranking industrial firms will have booths at the Exposition.
