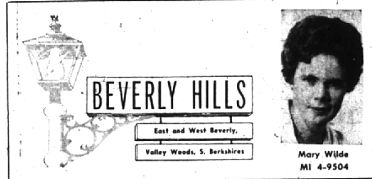




A Gift of Goodies
