Sewer Projects Rank 1st **Among Community Goals**

As the door closed on another year of governmental activity, the aspirations and plans of officials opened another to the anticipated progress of 1961.

What's in store for Birmingham and its neighboring communities? The mayors and city managers of the surrounding areas offer a keyhole peek at future programs.

BIRMINGHAM

Mayor Florence Willett and City Manager L. R. Gare agree that the construction of the 45 million dollar Twelve-Town Drain, which is being forestalled by court litigation, is the major goal. The project, a series of relief drains for southeastern Oakland County, will enable Birmingham to install a trusk sewer which will provide considerable relief to residential areas on the east side of the city.

THE NEW SEWER will serve an area between Eton and W. Columbia from Lincoln to Maple and between Rugby and the Grand Trunk Railroad from an area north of Maple.

Second top project will be additional parking area in the downtown business district. Plans are in process for the acquisition and enlargement of existing parking facilities in the Northwest Quadrant which will be increased from 250 to about 400 parking spaces.

Also hoped for are: improvement of US.-10 right-of-way where access drives do not exist; surfacing of Quarton Road from Woodward to Labser which has been delayed for engineering reasons; and opening of 14 Mile Road for Maple traffic relief.
