will permit Detroit "to extend service to new customers and improve service to existing customers as quickly as possible and at the least possible cost to all concerned." Remus stated.

THE LAKE HURON project is part of a \$112 million development program announced in 1955. It is designed to enable the Detroit department to serve five million people in the six-county metropolitan area by 1960.

Detroit plans to build a raw water intake in Lake Huron, a complete treatment and pumping plant near Fort Huron and 90-inch transmission mains to bring treated water to this area.

Cost of the first stage of these facilities was estimated as \$82,785,000 when the project was announced back in '50.

Remus said a second intake located some distance north of the present Detroit River intake will make the system less vulnerable to attack and pollution.

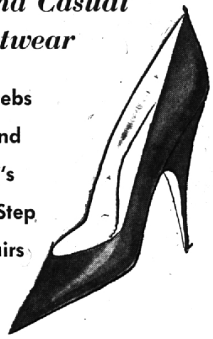
