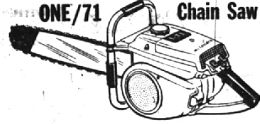


Board of Directors Appoints Schubel

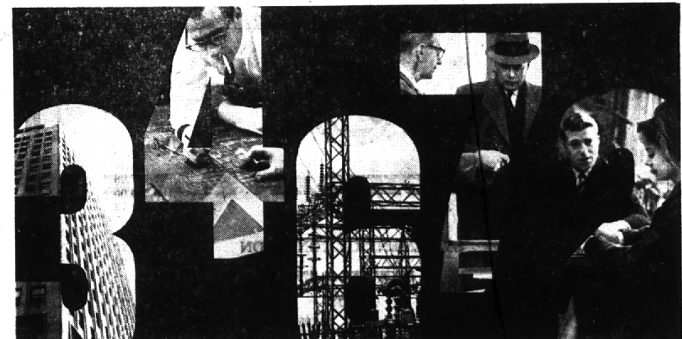
