MSU Offers Course on Communism

In an attempt to enable citizens to better understand and do something about communism rather than merely talk about it, the Continuing Education Program at Michigan State University Oakland is offering a ten-week course on the subject.

Based on the theory that knowledge must precede intelligent action, five MSU experts will instruct on how and why communism developed and what makes it tick.

Included in the study will be communism's future plans and problems as well as the problems it creates for the rest of the world.

Entitled "Communism in the Modern World", the course will begin Jan. 19 at MSU with a three-hour session led by Dr. Richard Burke (philosophy), on the ideas behind "scientific socialism" as formulated by its architects, Marx and Engels.

NEXT WILL BE a study of Communist thought and practice in Soviet Russia, led by Dr. Gerald Straka (history), and the special brand of it in Tito's Yugoslavia, directed by Serge Stashok (foreign languages), a Yugoslav.

Dr. Sheldon Appleton (political science), a specialist on China, will discuss Communism there, and Dr. Samuel Shapiro (history), will cover communism in Latin America.

The final sessions, on Communism and the Problems of Today's World, will be handled by a panel of the participating faculty members.

The work will consist of lectures as well as readings, discussion sessions and a few films.

THE TEN WEEKS spent in this course, said Dr. Lowell Eklund, director of Continuing Education, "should not only enable participants to understand the Communist movement better, but much more important, should encourage them to accept a vital responsibility as citizens. This it will do by giving them the understandings necessary to react to the most potent political philosophy confronting the whole idea of our way of life."

Two organizations have already made arrangements to take essentially the same course as groups. One is a group of ministers and their wives, known as the Clergy Friends of MSU.

Any other interested persons are invited to attend this series of Monday morning seminars from 10 a.m. to noon starting Jan. 23.

THE OTHER group, the Village Women's Club of Birmingham, will have a series of six lectures starting Jan. 19, at the Unitarian Church at Lone Pine and Hunter. This will be the first Continuing Education course to be offered by MSU off campus.
