Izell Jones, 28, pleaded guilty to the charge at his arraignment in Municipal Court Friday. He will be sentenced Jan. 27.

THE OTHER FIVE, Leonard Ruffins, 28, Anna P. Smoots, 28, Beulah Williams, 27, Marie Lowry, 43, and Rena Melnia, entered inchoate pleas to the same charge. They will stand trial on Jan. 27.

Four of the five were released on \$100 bond each. The fifth, Rena Melnia, was returned to the county jail on a probation violation.

YMCA Week will be observed Jan. 22-29. As part of the program, 517 boys will appear in the pulpits of many Protestant churches on Sunday of that week.

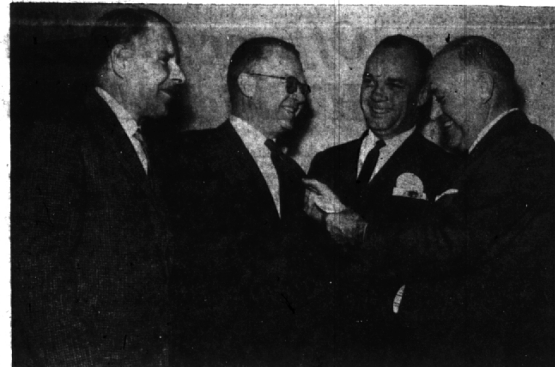
Other observances will be in the form of open house activities, skill demonstrations and athletic contests.

B'ham Lawmakers OK Oak St. Bridge Plans

Birmingham city commissioners approved preliminary plans for construction of one bridge Monday night and rescinded approval of another.

They okayed preliminary plans for a new bridge on Oak St. over the Rouge River between Lakeside and Lakeside streets. Plans call for a 44-foot wide roadway.

They also rescinded their approval of the previous week of preliminary plans for the Willis St. bridge.

Estimated cost of the Oak St. bridge was reported at \$61,000 by the consulting engineers. Next step will be to make construction drawings.

PLANS CALL for the bridge to have a six-foot wide sidewalk on each side.

Approximately 75 feet of strip pavement, 16 feet wide, will have to be removed and replaced to make the new bridge possible, it was explained. Commissioners made no decision on this factor, however.

Last week, commissioners approved plans for the Willis St. bridge at an estimated cost of \$46,700, including approaches.

This week, City Manager L. R. Gare explained that a culvert type of bridge could be constructed at an estimated cost of \$50,000, which is \$1,000 less than the city's original estimate.

COMMISSIONERS can reapprove plans as submitted last week or instead approve the culvert type structure.

Whatever type bridge is decided upon, Commissioner Carl E. Ingram has requested that it be in keeping with the setting of the area.
