The Vienna Choir Boys Slated to Appear Here

The Vienna Choir, made up of 22 boys between the ages of eight and 14, have sung in all of America's leading concert halls and theatres.

In New York they have often been heard at Carnegie Hall and Town Hall and on television and motion pictures. The boys of the historic Seminary School are equally well-known throughout the world. They appear regularly in the Orient as well as in the West.

EVERY YEAR, ten per cent of the number of applicants are admitted to the institution. Before admissions to one of the choirs, students receive two years of training. The school maintains three choirs at all times. Two are avail-

able for touring, while one is always in Vienna.

Their program opens with religious selections, including sacred songs in Latin, some written in the 16th and 17th centuries. These are followed by a short opera with some of the boys changing from their traditional sailor suits to high-heeled shoes, dresses and wigs for a delightful excursion into make-believe and high jinks.

WHEN A BOY'S voice changes, his service with the Vienna Choir Boys is over. But he isn't just a "has-been" at the age of 13 or so. The organization maintains another home in Vienna and cares for the boys, seeing them through their education and preparing them, whenever possible, for their chosen place in life.
