**LEGAL NOTICE**

Rules and Regulations Governing the Use and Occupancy of State Lands Other than State Parks and Recreation Areas

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Commission of Conservation by the provisions of Act No. 17, Public Acts of 1921, as amended, the following rules and regulations are hereby made and adopted concerning the use and occupancy of state lands other than state parks and recreation areas administered by or under the control of the Department of Conservation.

It shall be unlawful:

1. To enter, use, or occupy state lands for any purpose when said lands are posted against such entry, or occupancy, as determined by the Director of Conservation.
2. To remain on state lands for more than 20 days without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.
3. To camp on state lands overnight at designated public fishing sites unless the owner's name and address, in legible letters, is affixed to the boat.
4. To store or leave boats, fish chums, or other property for more than 20 days without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.
5. To leave unburied refuse and rubbish, including tin cans, bottles, and fish offal, or to deposit same in any other receptacles must be used where applicable.
6. To build a fire without proper provision to prevent spreading, or to leave said fire without extinguishing same.
7. To remove, destroy, mutilate, or deface posters, notices, signs, or markers of the Department of Conservation, or of any other agency of government.
8. To post, place, or erect signs, to place or distribute advertising material, to erect a fence or barrier, to construct or occupy improvements, or to enclose state lands without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.
9. To use state lands for commercial purpose without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.
10. To erect state lands without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.

These rules and regulations shall be in force and effect May 1, 1951.

Violations to perform any act set forth in the rules in paragraph 1 to 10 shall be fined not more than \$100 and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

These rules are to take effect February 11, 1961, supersede, and repeal E.O. 1361 governing the use and occupancy of state lands as contained in Act No. 1929 of the 1954 Administrative Code.
