Public Relations Committee Set Up In Southfield

SOUTHFIELD—Dr. Ira Altshuler, member of the Southfield school board, has been appointed chairman of the School-Community Relations Committee for Southfield Public Schools.

The goal of the committee "is not only to seek improved communication with the press and other media... but to maintain a continuous flow of accurate information to all people in the district relative to practices, proposed changes, newly adopted policies and other vital information about our public schools."

It will also seek "to provide an agency through which citizens may communicate their needs, problems and educational expectations to those who are responsible for the education" of children in the district.

AMONG the organizations invited to appoint representatives to the committee are the governments of Southfield and Lathrup, the Southfield Area PTA Council, Non-Contractual Employees Association and Southfield Education Association.

A representative from industry as a whole and one from among school principals as well as one from area press, radio and television will also be invited to serve on the committee. Representatives from the school board and school administration will also be on the committee.

The establishment of the committee grew out of a recommendation made by the Curriculum Advisory Committee of the Southfield Area PTA Council last summer, which was accepted by the Board of Education.
