Two Southfield High Seniors are eligible for 1961 National Honor Society Scholarships, Principal Robert E. Hall announced last week.

Suggest Council, School Board Study On Assessments

SOUTHFIELD — Mayor Donald L. Swanson last week suggested in a letter to the Southfield City Council that the Southfield School Board and the Council each appoint a three-member committee to study school board payment of special assessments for local improvements.

According to Swanson, present Michigan law allows, but does not make payment mandatory. Swanson also stated that legislation has been introduced in the past, and will be again this year, to make such payment necessary.

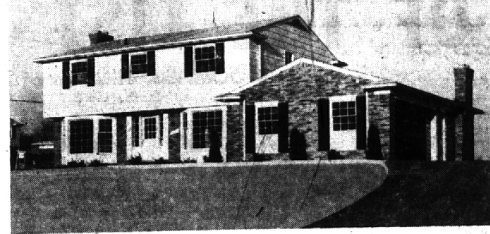
