SOUTHFIELD — Det. Edward Gleza, Redford Township, said a statement by James A. Smith, companion of Robert Baker, 18-year-old Southfield youth who died in an accident while being rushed to a hospital Jan. 9, coincided with a medical examiner's report, showing that Baker had been drinking.
