Eight Candidates Petition for Race In Troy Primary

TROY—More contenders have officially joined the Troy primary race scheduled for Feb. 20. Eight will compete for the city's two commission posts. Four candidates will be nominated in the primary. Those who have filed petitions include Commissioner Louis Yanich, and former Commissioner George T. Yeokum.
T. DEWEY BENNETT, 2075 Alfred, a candidate for the commission last year, and Clark D. Gill, 2631 Lane, a Troy School Board candidate in 1956, are also in the running.
Those who filed earlier were Mrs. Joseph R. Schemansky Jr., 6213 Malvern; John C. Czarnowski, 2831 Fernside; James Carey, 1814 Witherbee, and Robert Barget, 246 Lovell.

CHARLES H. LOSEY and Ceville H. Mason, both incumbent justices of the peace have filed for re-election.
The two commission positions that will be contested in the April election are held by Yanich and Stanley Smith. Smith is not running for re-election.

Village Women's Group OK's \$130,000 Clubhouse Purchase

Three hundred members of the Village Woman's Club met at the Birmingham Community House Tuesday morning and approved purchase of a permanent clubhouse for their permanent clubhouse. Purchase price of the building and property is \$130,000.
The women voted to proceed with sale of property now owned by the club at the corner of Woodward and Chesterfield.
New home of the club is located on seven acres of landscaped lawns fronting on the south side of East Long Lake Road in Bloomfield Hills. This property was originally purchased in 1919 by Charles Winingham from John Vhay.
AT THAT TIME there was a barn on the site and connected to it a schoolhouse, which Vhay had moved from nearby Woodward Ave. Beans from the barn were used in the present structure and may be seen in the future club lounge.
In 1922, the west wing of the house was added and, in 1929, the east wing completing the renovation of one of Bloomfield's most picturesque estates.
Shortly after World War II, the house was converted into five apartments, which presently exist. Robert Swanson was the architect of the original project.
PURCHASE OF this property will enable Village Woman's Club to immediately have a permanent clubhouse—occupancy is scheduled for Nov. 1—in which to fulfill the purpose for which the club was formed and to centralize its cultural and philanthropic activities. It is planned eventually to make the clubhouse equivalent to a new building.
Building committee chairman Mrs. Theodore F. W. Meyer was assisted in this two-year project by Mrs. Harvey Kreege, Mrs. Edward Moseman, Mrs. Dwight Ensign, Mrs. Brooks Marshall, Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson, Mrs. Sheldon Noble and Elmer L. Sylvester.
