**Bonding Proposition**

Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Four Million One Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand (\$4,135,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting and furnishing additional new school buildings; erecting and furnishing additional new school buildings; improving existing school buildings and sites; and acquiring additional school sites in said School District?
