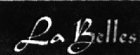

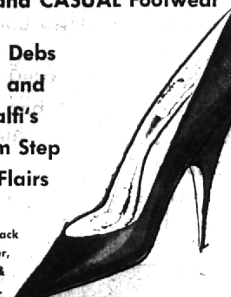

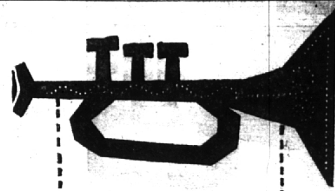
His radio and movie credits include NBC's "March of Time", "Gangbusters", "The Lone Ranger" and the "Green Hornet".

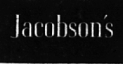

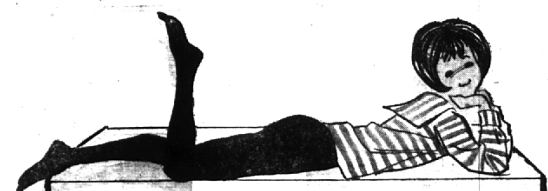
