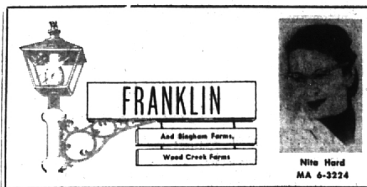

Bingham to Inspect Swimming Pools Under New Rules

BINGHAM FARMS — Local swimming pools will be inspected in the next few weeks to make sure they meet requirements of the swimming pool ordinance which becomes effective by May 1.

Councilman Donald Morse suggested the council appoint a committee to take-over the task so that pool owners will have ample time to make adjustments if necessary.

THE COUNCIL also functioned as a zoning board of appeals Monday night to hear more discussion on the property variance problem of Mr. and Mrs. E. Griggs. Further objections were heard, although the Griggs have considered acquiring additional property to meet zoning restrictions.

It was stated that though the Griggs might be able to match the 60,000 square feet necessary, only part of it would be within the village limits of Bingham Farms and therefore, still not a satisfactory solution.

THE COUNCIL also heard a request to have an abandoned shack removed from vacant property. Neighbors report that smoke has been seen coming from the small structure, and occasionally it is used as a meeting place for youth not identified with the village.

Councilman Neil Warren was assigned to contact the property owner for its removal to avert any possible mishap.

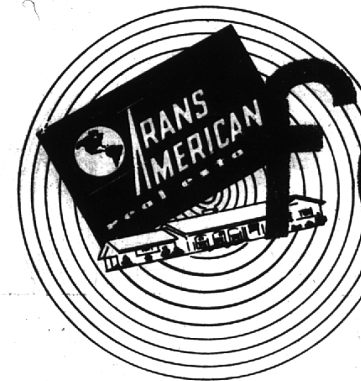
