

Franklin Knoll Sewer Lateral Work to Start

WEST BLOOMFIELD — Bonds to finance construction of a sewer lateral in Franklin Knoll subdivision have been sold to Knower-MacArthur Co. It is announced at West Bloomfield Township Board meeting last Wednesday. Construction of the lateral begins this week.

Interest rate on the 10-year, \$100,000 bond issue is 3.23 per cent.

OTHER SUBDIVISION matters were also taken up at the meeting. Speaking for Knollwood subdivision, George Back, of 6825 Country Club Lane, asked the township board to consider installation of a street light at the subdivision's Maple road entrance.

A request from Powder Horn estates for a street light at the Mid-dibelt entrance was taken under consideration.

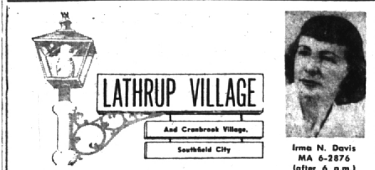
The hearing will be at 8 p.m. in the village offices, 18500 W. 13 Mile Road.

Lathrup Expects County, State Okay on Sewers

LATHRUP—Mayor Richard N. Cogger said the city would probably have approval, within the next week, for four sanitary spurs, connecting with the proposed interceptor.

Application for an amendment to sanitary construction permit 19011, covering building of the spurs, must be obtained from the county DPW and the state health department.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR Jerald Stone said that Gianetti Brothers Construction Co. was ready to start

sanitary sewer construction within one to two weeks after the date for sale of the bond issue is set.

Stone was directed by the council to check into the status of the City's Federal Grant Program application. He indicated that Lathrup was "too far down the list" to benefit, at last report.

Stone was told to work with ALN&M engineer Ray Smit to negotiate with the Oakland County Road Commission as to its proportionate fair share of draining county roads within the city.

Cogger said the storm water program would drain 71 and 12 Mile roads as well as Southfield and Evergreen Roads. The law permits the county to pay their share, he said. Stone is to report back to the council on the matter.

S'field Turns Down Recreation Center

SOUTHFIELD — The Zoning Board of Appeals unanimously rejected a proposal Monday to convert the 20-acre Agatias Dam property to a commercial recreation center. The site is located on Southfield between 12 and 13 Mile Roads.

The petition was filed by Seymour Miller of Southfield, late last year. Miller and Carl Schey of Oak Park planned to install a swimming pool, shuffleboard courts, archery range, trampolines, go-cart track, kiddieland rides and a miniature golf course, as well as baseball diamonds and a 600-car parking lot.

Residents claimed the project would be noisy and a nuisance.

About a dozen persons attended the hearing.

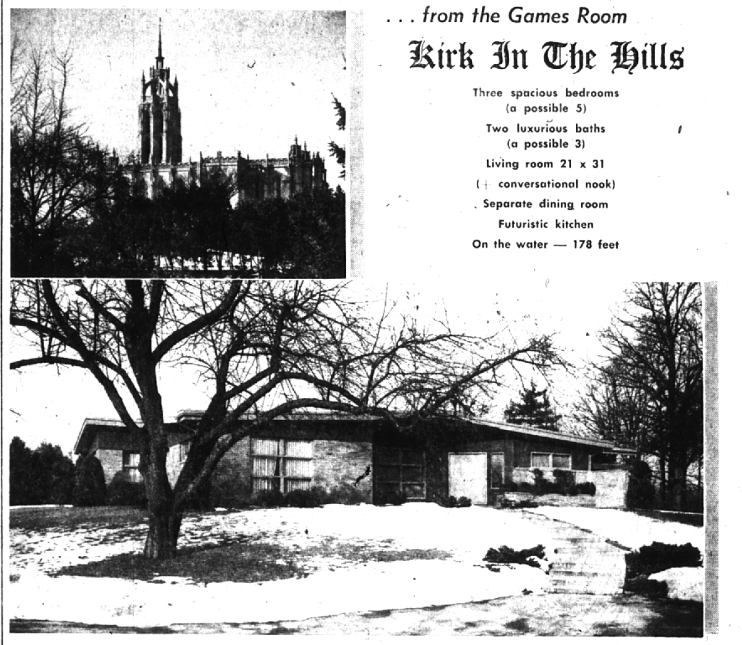

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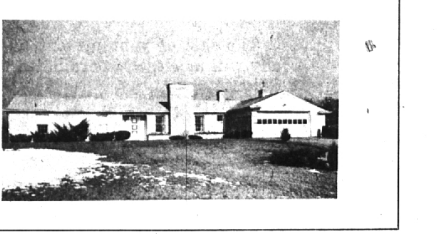
