

Burglars 'Tripped Up'; One Admits 26 Thefts

SOUTHFIELD — Two burglars who tripped an alarm in a Southfield hardware store Friday stumbled into the hands of police, spilling information about a series of local and out-of-state crimes.

Richard Lee Goonin, 22, Detroit, was arrested at the scene. His accomplice, George Horton, 20, was arrested Saturday afternoon at his home in Royal Oak.

Horton cleared up 26 burglaries in Southfield, Royal Oak, Detroit, Ferndale, Ypsilanti and Lansing, according to Southfield Det. David Bourgeois, who arrested him.

Patrolman William Kemper, Southfield police, and Det. George Craft, Redford Post, Michigan State Police, assisted in the arrest. The burglaries date back to March, 1960, police said.

HORTON IMPLICATED Goonin in eight of the burglaries and also said a third man was involved. Goonin was arrested at the Federal Hardware and Supply Co., 29000 Southfield Road.

The third man is under arrest near Sacramento, Calif., accused of burglary and carrying concealed weapons.

The 26 thefts listed by Horton included three in Southfield, five

were at the Federal Hardware, one of them in November, and one was at the Everett Hardware, Dec. 14. The latter store is located at 25025 Telegraph.

BOTH MEN ARE held in county jail, pending arraignment Monday in circuit court.


Horton was arraigned last Monday in Southfield Municipal Court before Judge Clarence A. Red, Jr. He pleaded guilty and was bound over to circuit court. He was unable to meet bond, set at \$2500.

\$2,000 BOND was set by Judge Red when Goonin was arraigned in Southfield on Friday. He, too, was unable to post bond.



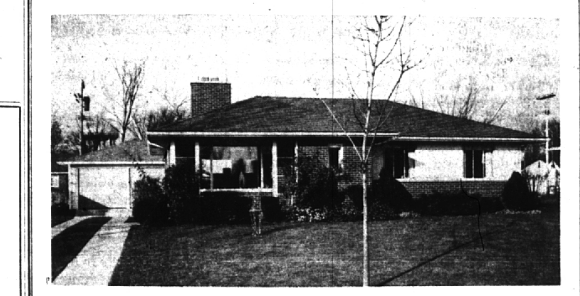
