Falcon Tankers Dunked By Fitzgerald, 58-46

A strong Fitzgerald swimming team staved off a late rally to defeat determined Groves, 58-46, Friday at the Falcon's home pool.

The Falcons won five out of the ten swimming events, but as in previous meets the diving made a big difference. Fitzgerald collected all eight diving points as Groves is without a diver.

IN THE FIRST race of the evening Groves' Bob Graham fared in the next to the last lap and was overtaken by Jay Ptasnik of Warren's Fitzgerald, who won with a time of 4:58.

Falcon's Bob Sutton lost in a photo-finish to Bill Brockman in the 50-yard freestyle. Brockman's time was 24.9.
