Far East Specialist To Lecture

Mrs. Irene Murphy, who is a Far East specialist and a member of the Village Woman's Club, will be guest speaker at the next monthly luncheon, Feb. 1st, at Oakland Country Club. The subject of her talk will be "Solving Economic Problems with Asian Villages."

Mrs. Murphy is an authority on practical economic aid to needy countries. She helped develop the native skills of the village artisans in the Philippines, then sold their products to over one thousand stores in this country through her own business, known as Contemporary Crafts Imports.

BEFORE THIS Mrs. Murphy spent five years in the Philippines as a technical assistance field worker for the United Nations and the United States. In this capacity, she demonstrated to isolated communities how to adapt their materials and abilities to the requirements of the export market.

Mrs. Murphy received an award from Philippine president Carlos P. Garcia last December for having helped to develop industries and to organize a community fund program in the Philippines.

As a Regent of the University of Michigan, Mrs. Murphy is currently serving an eight-year term to which she devotes over a quarter of her time. Last year she completed an extensive tour of nine foreign countries, making further studies of native skills and products.

The first Monday of every month, matter points will be given. Refreshments will be served. All bridge players are invited. Further information can be gained from Mrs. Larry Trager.

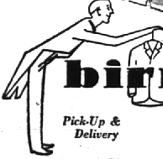
