day within three weeks, the quiescent larva secretes an alkaline fluid which softens one end of the cocoon and the newly formed life comes forth, a crumpled adult moth.

The cocoons, each composed of about 1,000 feet of continuous thread are then heated by steam or treated with chemicals killing the larvae within. They are then sorted for color and texture and the thread is skillfully unwound and then rewound on wheels to form reels of raw silk. It is then boiled, scoured, steamed, stretched and purified by acids or fermentation.

It is subsequently washed to remove gum and bring out its luster and finally combed and untangled to be spun into cloth. The commercial value of the resulting silk is from \$200 to \$500 million dollars per year.

This column was suggested by a Royal Oak kindergarten teacher whose inventive ways with children I have long admired. It was she who ordered the eggs from a silkworm dealer in New Jersey. Before following the life-cycle with her class, she divided the larvae with your scribe and several interested teachers. In turn, the caterpillars also reached the pupils in a day camp and a science class Cranbrook Institute.

We are faithfully feeding our eight larvae with leaves from our mulberry tree and from their size and inertness, we believe they are almost ready to pupate.

Thus is knowledge spread. Like a pebble cast into the water, the waves spread outward ever reaching toward more distant shores.

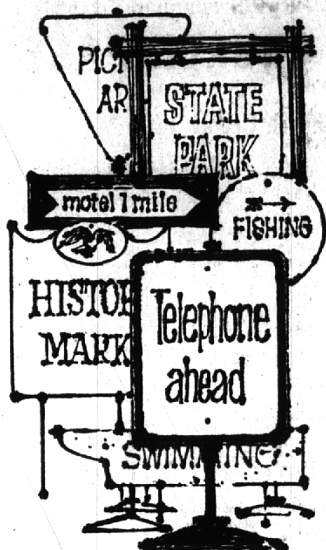
No Objections To 12 Towns At Hearings
