State Fair Service Features Minister

Birmingham area residents will be afforded an opportunity to hear Dr. Raymond Lindquist, minister of the First Presbyterian Church of Hollywood, Calif., at the Michigan State Fair Sept. 5. Dr. Lindquist, president of the Board of National Missions of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States, will be the main speaker for the state fair's 11th annual Sunrise Service. The service will be held outdoors in the Music Shell at the State Fairgrounds in Detroit. The service, co-sponsored by the Detroit Council of Churches, is one of the greatest religious mass meetings in the country, attracting from 8,000 to 10,000 worshippers. Bookmobile Visits Comfort Shut-Ins

Among summer church projects in process in Birmingham is a bookmobile program. Diligently conducted by a small group of St. James Episcopal Church Women, the project involves periodic visits to the shut-ins of the parish.

Headed by Christian Education Chairman Mrs. George K. Mosko, 476 Park, Birmingham, these volunteers, women, call on elderly infirm parishioners with inspirational reading material and news of the parish.

THE VISITS, which provide an opportunity for a friendly chat, are appreciated by the shut-ins as much as the books they receive. Frequently a cup of tea or coffee accompanies the welcomed conversation.

Literature disseminated by the bookmobile (actually private cars of various members) is kept by the shut-ins until the next visit when new books replace the old.

IN ADDITION to homes within St. James parish, calls are made on persons in nursing homes such as Arnold Home in Detroit.

Originating last spring the bookmobile visits open new interests for the shut-ins who anxiously anticipate "the next trip."
