Social Chairman Of Alpha Alpha

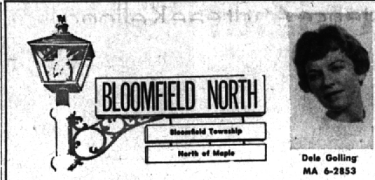
