**What to Do About School Needs?—Decision Wanted**

Citizens of Birmingham School District must be making a decision soon, city commissioners were told this week.

School problems were outlined in a letter to the commission from Mrs. Kathryn T. Loomis, president of the board of education. "As you may already be aware," she wrote, "the citizens of Birmingham School District must, in the not too distant future, decide how they wish to meet a number of educational needs which have been developing over a period of time."

SHE LISTED these needs as follows:

- 1) The six-mill operating levy will expire with collection of taxes in December.
- 2) Enrollment pressures are mounting in several elementary schools and at Groves Junior-Senior

High School. Classroom space throughout the district will be at a premium in 1961-62.

3) It is becoming increasingly difficult to staff the schools with the quality of personnel the community expects.

4) Citizens have indicated through the recently-completed three-year curriculum study that serious consideration should be given to major improvements in curriculum and its supervision.

MRS. LOOMIS said, "The board of education and administration are developing a five-year budget projection which will reflect, in their best judgment, long-range instructional and supporting needs of the schools."

"A reorganizing of building needs being studied by Ohio State University will soon be available. When the information becomes available, the board hopes that our citizens will join in a careful study and evaluation."

"The question as to when our citizens should be asked to vote support for the schools is currently uppermost in our minds. Several considerations enter in:

- 1) "ADDITIONAL... cities will be required by September, 1962. Planning time will, therefore, be restricted.
- 2) "So that budget planning..."

staffing can proceed effectively and efficiently, our administration needs to know what level of support the community will provide prior to beginning these functions in January, 1962.

"Sufficient time must be made available for citizens to study needs before called upon for a decision."

MRS. LOOMIS said no ideal date could be set for a decision, but added that the board feels the "planning needs of the district could best be served" by setting a November election date.

"She asked commissioners to take an active personal interest in becoming informed when study materials are available" and to consider devoting time in the fall to "group study of school needs."

**Romney Supports Open Convention**

George Romney of Bloomfield Hills joined other Republican leaders and Con-Con candidates Monday in endorsing open sessions at the Constitutional Convention.

The president of American Motors referred to two of many reasons for public meetings.

Romney said the Con-Con will offer "a splendid means of informing citizens of the fundamental principles of representative government."

IN ADDITION, he said the final outcome of the convention will depend on intelligent, informed action by the voters.

George Van Pearson, Republican state chairman, supported a Michigan Press Association resolution asking that all convention meetings be open to the press and public.

The day before Governor John Swainson issued a statement favoring a "fishbowl" atmosphere for the 144 convention delegates meet in Lansing Oct. 3 to study Michigan's constitution.
