didates in the limited period of time available since the final filing date for the Convention. It prepared its ratings and analysis by use of a QUESTIONNAIRE, covering education, experience, etc., CREDIT RATINGS and COURT RECORDS, and a COMMITTEE INTERVIEW.

"EACH COOPERATING candidate was factually scored on his education, his familiarity with governmental issues and the independent judgment of each committeeman. The sum of these individual evaluations was then added. Then after a comparison was made between each individual candidate and his (or her) opponent for the same party, it is felt that by showing the actual scores, a closer appraisal of the differences between candidates is evidenced.

"IT MUST be remembered that, IN THE PRIMARY WE COMPARE CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR THE SAME POST IN THE SAME PARTY, NOT IN THE OPPOSING PARTY. Candidates who for some reason do not cooperate are listed but not rated. We appreciate the cooperation of the majority who furnished the requested information and who appeared for the committee interview.

"The Committee claims neither a flawless system nor superior judgment. It does believe however, that as the complexities of everyday living are compounded by the intricacies of government, the average voter is in need of help.

"VOTE FOR good nominees at the July 25 primary. Good candidates will provide a good selection in the final election in September. And, we need the best people available, for the writing of what we hope will be a better Constitution for the State of Michigan."

AS YOU probably know, both major political parties have candidates in next Tuesday's primary election. The candidates of both Democrat and Republican parties who place first in this balloting will face the voters Sept. 12, when the one with the largest vote will represent his District when the Constitutional Convention convenes in Lansing Oct. 3.

Republican George Romney and Democrat William A. O'Brien, Jr., will not be on the primary ballot inasmuch as they are unopposed within their respective parties.
