Bloomfield Hills Baptist Church will hold a ground-breaking ceremony at 4 p.m. Sunday at its new \$125,000 church building at 3600 Telegraph, north of W. Long Lake Road.

The new building, including a chapel and educational unit, will be ready for occupancy by November according to church officers.

Interim Pastor O. W. Stucky and Moderator Clare Cook will conduct the ground-breaking ceremony.

AFFILIATED WITH the North American Baptist General Conference, the church was incorporated in April, 1960, with 21 charter members.

Since then, the church's membership has grown to 49 with weekly services held in the Hickory Grove Thruout in Bloomfield Hills.

The work of the church has been progressing steadily, generating considerable community interest.

ASSISTING Bloomfield Hills Baptist in reaching the goal of obtaining its own building have been the time and missionary funds of Grasse Pointe Baptist Church, Rev. O. W. Stucky of Detroit, a traveling evangelist, has been serving as interim pastor since the Rev. Arthur Alcorn's departure in May.

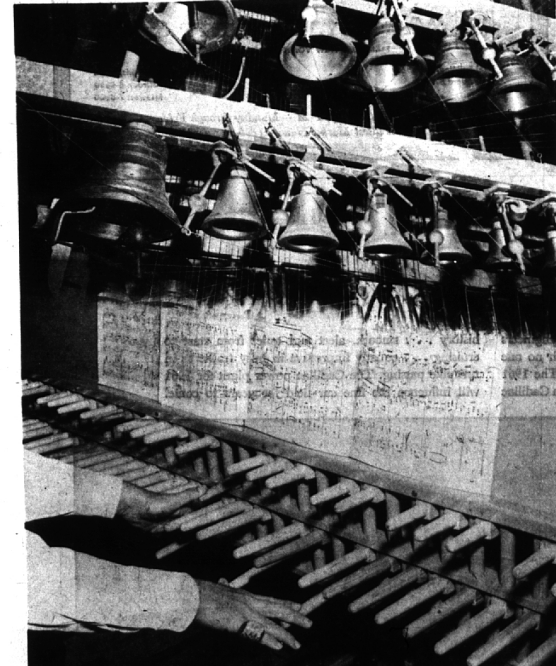
