Teachers' Institute Sets Up Speakers

Representatives of Birmingham's educational system attending the State Teachers Institute Oct. 19-20 will hear several guest speakers. The conference is scheduled for Detroit's Cobo Hall Oct. 19 and in the schools of the region Oct. 20.

Keynote general session speaker for the combined Regions 2, 3, 6, and 7 conference, sponsored by the Michigan Education Association, will be General Carlos P. Romulo, Philippine Ambassador to the United States and Pulitzer-prize winning novelist.

FORMER PRESIDENT of the United Nations fourth general assembly and noted statesman, soldier and diplomat, Romulo will address the group on "The Asia America Does Not Know."

Other speakers will include Dr. Lynn M. Bartlett, state superintendent of public information, and George N. Lauser, MEA president and registrar at Central Michigan University.

Over 200 teachers and administrators from the eight-county area in southeastern Michigan are expected to attend the conference. Oakland County is Region 7.

AREA SCHOOLS will be closed during the two-day institute to permit educators to participate in two general sessions with well-known speakers Oct. 19 and group meetings Oct. 20.

McParlin Attending Nat'l War College

Colonel James H. McParlin, 1022 Top View, Birmingham, is attending a Defense Seminars seminar this month at the National War College in Washington, D.C. His participation in the seminar is an effort to alert local leadership groups to the dangers of cold war conflict, which is one of his tasks as commander of the 403rd Troop Carrier Wing at Selfridge Air Force Base.

A senior pilot in the Reserves for 20 years of service, Col. McParlin is one of 40 reserve officers selected to attend the seminar.

Troy Calls Hearing on Water Mains

A Troy public hearing July 31 may bring about a new policy regarding the cost of water mains installed in special assessment districts in Troy.

The hearing is designed specifically to consider the installation of a 12-inch water main on E. Long Lake Road from Rochester Road to 320 feet John E. Several requests for the construction of a main to relieve a critical water shortage in the area have been made by property owners along E. Long Lake Road.

A PETITION SIGNED by 53 per cent of the property owners, who want a line installed under a special assessment agreement, has been presented to the city commission by Mrs. Richard Hollingsworth, 1238 E. Long Lake road.

The commission is undecided as to the percentage of costs that should be paid by the city. Residents, who previously petitioned for the main, paid the cost of a 6-inch line.

However, City Manager David E. Firestone said that a line on E. Long Lake would be a major east-west feeder main. Firestone said he could not recommend a 6 or 8-inch line, pointing out that Troy's main plan requires a 16-inch main in that area.

EVENTUALLY, the E. Long Lake line will connect into a large main on Dequindre which will give Troy residents Detroit water. A 35-year contract to buy Detroit water was approved by the city commission last week.

Because residents along E. Long Lake will be benefiting from a better line, Firestone said their share of the cost would be greater. Firestone suggests assessing \$4 per foot for the line and recommended that the commission establish a standard price for all special assessment water districts in the future.

Ernest Rumsby, executive director of Y. A., appointed Mrs. Edwin V. Clarke of Birmingham and Mrs. William A. Clemmons of Bloomfield Township as coordinating district leaders.

Broomfield Criticizes Farm Surplus Order

An administrative order to permit surplus farm goods to be shipped to Iron Curtain countries was termed "extremely naive and ill-timed" by Congressman William S. Broomfield (R-Oakland County).

Broomfield said that American taxpayers will foot the bill through subsidies for part of the cost of wheat, corn, rice and cotton shipments to Russia, Czechoslovakia and other Eastern bloc nations.

The Commerce Department order, issued June 22, excludes re-shipment of surplus farm goods to Communist China, North Korea and North Viet Nam, but "this provision is meaningless," said Broomfield.

"I HAVE BEEN trying to find out from the Commerce Department what safeguards there would be to reshipment to Red China from

that we mean business in Berlin," said Broomfield.

"Yet, we now find that our Federal government condones selling to Khrushchev that product for which he has the greatest need, and that product is food."

Broomfield said it is "common knowledge throughout the world" that Communist agriculture production "is a flop."

"Russia isn't going to start a war against us unless that Nation has adequate food reserves," said Broomfield.
