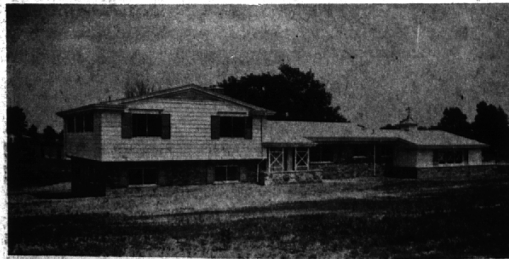

Change Boundary For Wing Lake School Students

BLOOMFIELD HILLS—A recommendation by Supt. Eugene Johnson to the Bloomfield Hills school board to change boundary lines for Wing Lake School for the coming school-year was adopted at a meeting of the school board Tuesday night.

The new boundary lines will include all areas of the school district lying south of Maple. Pupils living north of Maple, who have been attending the school will be transferred to Conant.

THE DECISION MEANS that pupils living in the immediate neighborhood of Wing Lake School, which is located on Wing Lake Road just north of Maple, will be among those transferred.

Admitting the awkwardness of the situation, the board agreed that school census figures for the coming year allowed no other alternative.

The situation is the result of a school-age population explosion in the area south of Maple. Wing Lake is the only school located reasonably near the vicinity.

The number of elementary-age children from this area attending Wing Lake School this fall includes inclusion of children from other areas formerly served by the school without severe overcrowding.

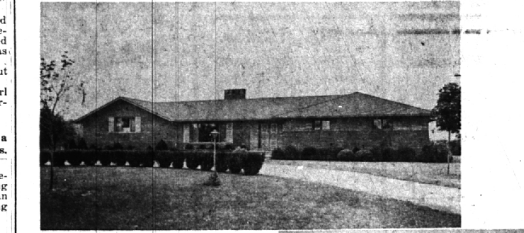

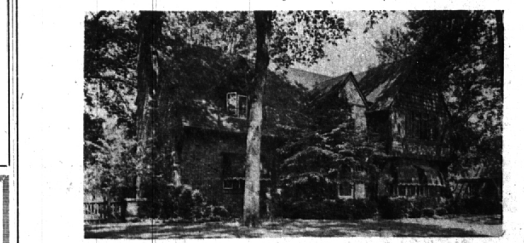
