**SWIMMING CLASSES:** There are openings in the second series of summer swimming classes being held at Derby, Barnum and Seeholm pools until August 12. Registrations will be accepted at the Recreation office, Municipal Building through Friday. Classes are held three afternoons per week for each division of swimmers. Schedules may be obtained at the Recreation office at the time of registration.

Recreational swimming is held each afternoon as follows:  
Derby: Monday through Saturday, 3:15-4:15, boys, 4:15-5:15, girls.  
Barnum Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, 2:45-3:30, boys and girls.  
Seeholm: Monday, Wednesday, Friday, 3:15-4:15, boys, 4:15-5:15, girls. Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, 2:45-3:30, boys, 4:00-5:15, girls.

Recreational swimming is open to anyone who can swim the width of the pool. Others must be accompanied in the water by a parent. Parents may attend during any recreational swim period (boys or girls) except on Tuesdays. Maximum height requirements at the pools: Derby, 40 inches from chin to floor.

## IF YOU HAVEN'T:

... put Pre-emergent control on your lawn in March or April you may be getting some CRABGRASS now. It will show up bright green, broad bladed and smut. Kill it, before it develops seed heads, with ORTHO LIQUID CRABGRASS KILLER, SUPER AERTOX or AERTOX SPECIAL with 2-D (kills broadleaf weeds too). All three of these are liquids to be diluted and sprayed. If you prefer a dry material to be applied with the spreader use the new STADLER'S XXX VANISH. ... Put fertilizer on the lawn for the second time this year, your grass may be looking a little pale. You should apply AGRICO L.F. at 20 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft. or Organic at 30 to 40 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft., or Agrinote at 30 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.

... Been spraying your roses regularly you may be providing a horde of aphids a dandy treat of rose juice. Black spot and mildew may be rising from the soil to exact their toll. You should spray once a week with combination of a good insecticide and a fungicide. May we suggest ISOTOX and CAPTAN or PHALTAN. The Phaltan works better in hose end sprayers, because you use less of it.

... Been feeding your flowers, both annual and perennial, every 3 or 4 weeks you may not get the blooms you'd hoped for. Feed flowers and vegetables either Stadler's Gard-N-Gro 4-12-4, or Agrico for Gardens 5-10-5. Both are high in phosphorus for root, fruit and flower development. Feed roses XXX Rose Maker. Do not feed roses after August 15th.

... Checked up on the hatching date for scale this year, here is the latest dope. It is behind schedule by about two weeks. In other words, it should be starting to hatch about NOW. Don't panic. Recent studies show that our standard insecticides, Malathion, Isotox, etc., are still effective against the newly hatched scale crawlers for many weeks longer than previously thought—possibly even through all of August and September. But to be on the safe side let's start a three spray program this week-end. Hit them again in two weeks (Aug. 5), and two weeks after that (Aug. 19). Be sure to pay particular attention to the underside of the leaves and twigs when spraying.

... Figured out why your lawn looked like a big green ashtray after your last patio party, it's because these new filter tips don't disintegrate and disappear like the old standard cigarette butt used to. Remedy: our cute '61 lawn ash trays. They come in white, pink, yellow and black, and cost 89¢ each or 4 for something under three dollars.

... Run out of patience waiting for your new shipment of fountains, hot baths and pedestals to arrive, take heart. Over a ton of these lovelies arrived Monday and should all be on display by the time you read this.
